GARDENING TIPS

September

In the San Francisco Bay Area Peninsula, this is a good time to start planting bulbs for spring. Plant garlic cloves two inches deep and 3-6 inches apart. There is still time to plant cool-season vegetables. As you pull up veggie plants that are no longer producing, compost only those that show no sign of disease. Plant colorful fall flowers such as pansies, violas, mums, stock, snapdragons, Iceland poppies and cyclamen. Fertilize azaleas, camellias and rhododendrons with fertilizer for acid-loving plants. As fruit grows on second-year growth, cut back fruited canes of raspberries, leaving new canes for fruiting next year.
